Section 2: Hazards Identification

Clear, colorless to pale yellow liquid, Strong, disagreeable odor.

DANGER! Flammable liquid and severe inhalation hazard.

Flammable liquid, keep away from all ignition sources.

Target organs: Liver, Kidneys, eyes, heart, Central nervous system.

Carbon Disulfide (75-15-0), >99%

Section 4: First Aid Measures

Always seek professional medical attention after first aid measures are provided.

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with excess water for 15 minutes, lifting lower and upper eyelids occasionally.

Skin: Immediately flush skin with excess water for 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing.

Ingestion: Call Poison Control immediately. **Aspiration hazard**. Rinse mouth with cold water. Give victim 1-2 tbsp of

activated charcoal mixed with 8 oz water.

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration.

Section 5: Fire Fighting Measures

Class IB Flammable Liquid. When heated to decomposition, emits acrid fumes of SOx.

Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters: Use foam or dry chemical to extinguish fire. Water may be ineffective. Firefighters should wear full fire fighting turn-out gear and respiratory protection (SCBA). Cool container with water spray. Material is not sensitive to mechanical impact. Product is sensitive to static discharge.

Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

Use personal protection recommended in Section 8. Isolate the hazard area and deny entry to unnecessary and unprotected personnel. Remove all ignition sources and ventilate area. Contain spill with sand or absorbent material and place material in a sealed bag or container for disposal. Wash spill area after pickup is complete. See Section 13 for disposal information.

Section 7: Handling and Storage Red

Handling: Use with adequate ventilation and do not breathe dust or vapor. Avoid contact with skins, eyes, or clothing. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.

Storage: Store in Flammable Area [Red Storage] with other flammable materials and away from any strong oxidizers. Store in a dedicated flammables cabinet. Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated, locked store room away from incompatible materials.
