<p>Please provide a brief explanation of why the 2017-18 and 2018-19 school year participation rates were below 95%. (250 words or less)</p>	<p>In response to the opt-out movement the district developed a range of local assessments to measure student achievement, growth and to identify students in need of academic intervention. These include mid-year common assessments, uniform district final exams (grades 6-8) and Regents exams in Algebra 1 and Living Environment (all non-NYSSA 8th grade students). Participation of all students on these locally determined assessments produces reliable data for both program and student evaluation. Consequently, the NYS 3-8 Assessments became less relevant to the daily practice of teaching and learning as local assessments filled the gap created by the opt-out movement. Changes to the NYS grades 3-8 ELA and math assessments (number of sessions, timing, and percentage of questions released) did not convince a sufficient number of parents to have their children participate in these assessments to reach the 95% participation target.</p>
<p>Provide a brief description of the Consultation and Collaboration process for development of the plan.</p>	<p>The stakeholder committee reviewed participation data and identified causes for low participation in the 2017-18 and 2018-19 school years. The committee then reviewed the documents provided in the NYSED Assessments Toolkit and considered other options for how to improve participation of the identified sub-groups on the 2020-21 NYS 3-8 ELA and math assessments.</p>
